Community Involvement in Decision Making

Registration

High school students will register according to the following schedule:

7th grade – Friday, August 11, 6:00 pm (parents need to attend, please) Orientation will meet in the cafeteria. If you are unable to register during your respective time, please call the Principal's office at **660-939-2135** for a scheduled time.

8th thru 12th grade – Thursday, August 17th 1:00 -5:00 pm All new students need to **bring immunization records**.

Elementary open house will be Thursday, August 17th. Open house times will be based on last names - 5:00-5:30 - A-G, 5:30 - 6:00 - H-P, 6:00-6:30 - Q-Z. Families with students with different last names can come together.

SKIP and STUCO will be providing hot dogs, Kool Kats, and light refreshments during Elementary Open House.

Immunization Requirements for School Children

All students must present proof of compliance with the immunization requirements set forth by the state on the first day of school. This applies to all students, including transfer students. Your cooperation with this requirement will be appreciated. If you have questions regarding the new immunization policy (JHCB), please call 660-939-2137.

Breakfast and Lunch Program

The following is a list of breakfast and lunch prices for the 2023-2024 year. Students whose lunch account balance reaches an unpaid \$25 will be offered an alternative lunch of a cheese/peanut butter sandwich and milk until the account is paid in full. Breakfast will be served on the **first day of school at the elementary and high school**. No extra entrees will be served at the elementary school.

Free and reduced lunch applications will be sent home with students the first day of school. We need only one application per family. **Please return forms to the school with the oldest child in the family as soon as possible.** Even if you don't wish to participate in the program we still request that you fill out the forms. <u>District state aid dollars are based on this count</u>. The more students who are eligible equals more dollars for our district. If you fill out the application, you are under no obligation to participate in the program. All applications will be kept confidential.

Prizes for completing Free and Reduced Lunch Applications

We are asking each family to complete an application. Each student's name that is on the application will go into a drawing for prizes. At the elementary we will be giving away a bicycle and at the high school \$50.00. It does not matter if you qualify for free or reduced funding or not. These applications need to be completed by September 8, the drawing will be on September 12.

Transportation

Nodaway-Holt R-VII School District contracts student transportation with First Student Bus Company. **Bus routes will remain the same as last year, unless a driver contacts you.** Bus drivers will be available at the elementary school Open House to assist you with any questions you have relating to your child's scheduled pick-up time and bus stops. (Check the front of this newsletter for registration information). We ask that you notify the driver the night before (if possible) if your child will not be riding. If this is not possible, please call the student prior to your pick-up to give the message to the bus driver. You may also call the Area Manager, Matthew Kreek at the bus barn anytime the day prior or before 6:30 AM the day of the absence at 660-442-5111. Some drivers leave by that time for their first pick up. Many factors affect the time the bus arrives at your home; however, once the arrival time has become fairly consistent, the bus will wait approximately one minute at your stop before going on. If the bus arrives early, the driver will wait longer. Encourage your children to be ready at least 10 minutes prior to your pick-up. To maintain a consistent schedule, we will need the cooperation of all.

Students living in Graham and Maitland who will need to ride a shuttle bus to another school building should arrive at school between **7:40 AM and 7:45 AM** to meet the shuttle bus. Shuttle buses **will not leave before 7:45 AM**. Students living in town **should** <u>not</u> arrive at school before **7:35 AM**. Teachers or an administrator will not be on duty before **7:35 AM**. Students will be picked up at their residence or bus stop unless other arrangements have been made with the parents/guardians of students.

School dismissal will be at 3:40 pm this year so afternoon drop-off times will be adjusted by approximately 5 minutes.

Text Messaging

TROJAN ALERTS are available to get important information regarding school events sent as text messages directly to your cell phone, wireless PDA or pager. These text messages contain emergency information, school closings, early dismissals and school event reminders. You may sign up by clicking on *Text Alerts* under the *Parents* section of the school website or by contacting the Elementary or High School offices for signup. Thank you to NW Cellular for sponsoring text caster free of charge and supporting our local communities.

School Cancellations and Postponements

Due to weather or other circumstances school may either be canceled or delayed two hours. The announcements of cancellation or delay will be given to the following Radio and TV stations: KQTV CH 2, KFEQ 68 AM, KSJQ 92.7 FM, KSFT 1550 AM, KMA 960 AM, KNIM 97.1 FM / 1580 AM & KKJO 105.5 FM. The district will also utilize the TROJAN ALERTS System through cell phones.

Sports

Any student wanting to participate in a fall sport should report to the first practice session or the first available date after the start of practice. Remember you must have **fourteen (14)** practice days in before you can participate in your first game. A reminder to any player or cheerleader, you must have **a health physical and proof of health/accident insurance** <u>before</u> you can start practice.

High School practices will begin on August 7th. Specific sport practice times to be determined. Junior High practices will begin on August 14th.

Admission to Athletic Events

Ticket prices for all athletic activities will be \$5.00 for adults and \$3.00 for students. Season tickets for athletics may be purchased at the gate for \$50.00 for adults, \$30.00 for students, or \$125.00 for a family. Golden age passes are available to individuals 62 years old or older for free. All Junior High and High School athletic events will be held at the Junior/Senior High facility in Graham with the exception of the Nodaway-Holt Invitational Volleyball Tournament. Games for the volleyball tournament will be played at both the Graham and Maitland gymnasiums.
